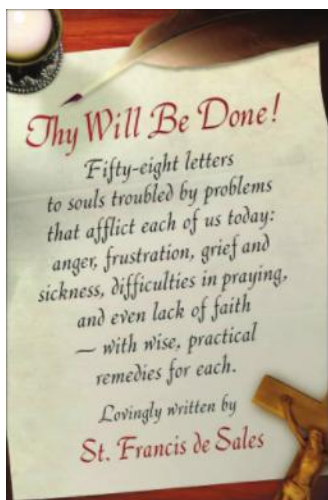

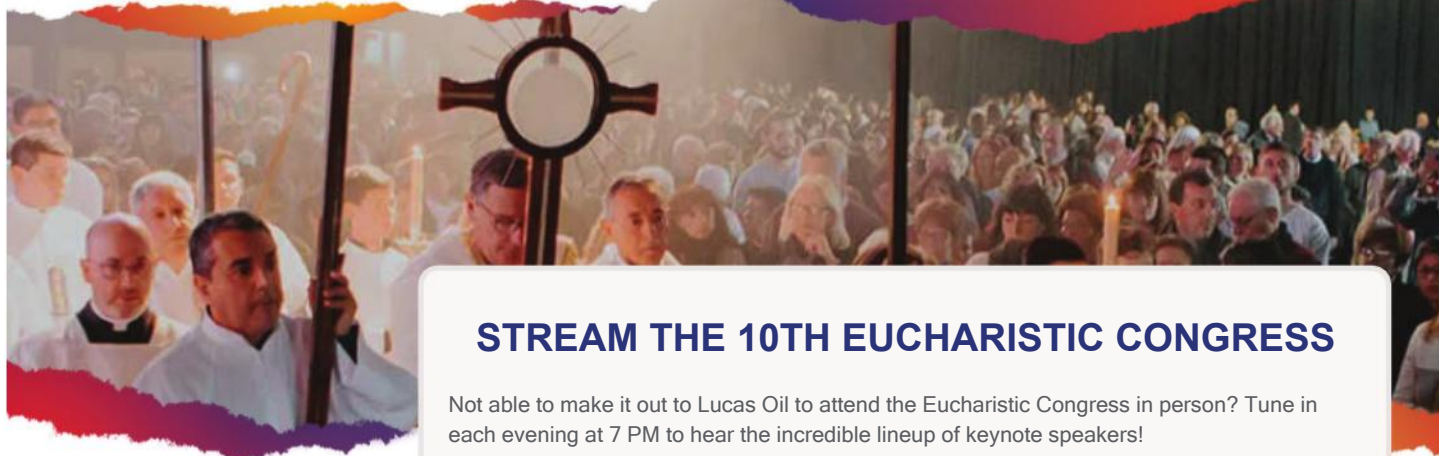
Thy Will Be Done! Letters of St. Francis De Sales

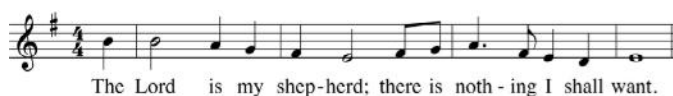


