

As we dive into the third year of the Eucharistic Revival, let us reinvigorate our participation at Mass and invite those who have wandered from our fold to return. Join us these next five weeks as we reflect on key components of the Mass and pray that our worship may be pleasing to God in Heaven as we give entirely of ourselves, together.

Source and Summit

"Nevertheless the liturgy is the summit toward which the activity of the Church is directed; at the same time it is the font from which all her power flows. For the aim and object of apostolic works is that all

who are made sons of God by faith and baptism should come together to praise God in the midst of His Church, to take part in the sacrifice, and to eat the Lord's supper." -Vatican II, Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, #10.

When you think about heaven, what immediately comes to mind for you? Is it puffy clouds, reunions with family members, angelic choirs singing while St. Peter greets each soul in a more positive spin on border



patrol? I think for a lot of us we can fall into this popular mindset of thinking that our final end will consist of some carefree paradise where we can enjoy all the pleasures of all our earthly life without the bitterness of sin undercutting these experiences. But what we really find when we look at the book of Revelation are scenes that likely sound strikingly familiar because they mimic moments of familiarity within the Mass. John's visions of heaven are fundamentally rooted in divine worship taking place on the Lord's Day. He describes scenes depicting the worship of God in His presence in the sanctuary, where priests and all the faithful offer praise and thanksgiving with references to the "Gloria", "Alleluia," "Holy, Holy Holy," and countless other threads leading back to the Liturgy of the Word and Eucharist. As Dr. Scott Hahn says, "The golden thread of liturgy is what holds together the apocalyptic pearls of John's Revelation." This connection not only gives greater credibility to the celebration of the Mass as being the desirable form of worship in the mind of God, but it also can create great excitement within us. Christ desires to give us a foretaste of His marriage feast, when he will marry us as the Church, by instituting the sacrament of the Eucharist and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. He also, through His Body and Blood, equips each of us with His very self to assist us in fulfilling our will of overcoming temptation, becoming great saints and uniting all to Him through the witness of His Church. The Eucharist, who is Christ Himself, truly, is both our source of life, just like the manna in the desert for the Israelites, and the summit of all our earthly days, pointing ahead for what awaits us on high. In this week ahead, I challenge you to examine how this truth of the faith can add to your understanding of and renew your participation in the Mass? How can the nourishment of the Eucharist give you the strength to live as a disciple?







The Jewish feast of Passover was near. When Jesus raised his eyes and saw that a large crowd was coming to him, he said to Philip, "Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?" He said this to test him, because he himself knew what he was going to do. Philip answered him, "Two hundred days' wages worth of food would not be enough for each of them to have a little." One of his disciples, Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, said to him, "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?" Jesus said, "Have the people recline." Now there was a great deal of grass in that place. So the men reclined, about five thousand in number. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining, and also as much of the fish as they wanted. When they had had their fill, he said to his disciples, "Gather the fragments left over, so that nothing will be wasted." So they collected them, and filled twelve wicker baskets with fragments from the five barley loaves that had been more than they could eat. When the people saw the sign he had done, they said, "This is truly the Prophet, the one who is to come into the world." Since Jesus knew that they were going to come and carry him off to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain alone.


