Saint John Vianney, Cure of Ars, is the patron saint of priests. He was known to be a great confessor and would stay in the confessional for long periods of time. It is said that he regularly spent from 14-18 hours a day hearing confessions. He was very humble and disciplined which gave him the gift of building a model parish. This is something we want to imitate at the Oratory. To have a church that is committed to pray for vocations and to have the sacrament of reconciliation available.

The Oratory of St. John Vianney at St. Anthony has a Holy Hour every first Monday of the month that we dedicate to praying for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. The Oratory has a first-class relic which is the chair that St. John Vianney had in his kitchen. It is said that he heard confessions many times from these chairs. This year we received permission to celebrate the feast day on Sunday. The music was planned around his feast day as well as the readings. A reception will be held after the 9:30 AM Sunday for parishioners and guests alike to celebrate this special day.

TOGETHER

As we dive into the third year of the Eucharistic Revival, let us reinvigorate our participation at Mass and invite those who have wandered from our fold to return. Join us these next five weeks as we reflect on key components of the Mass and pray that our worship may be pleasing to God in Heaven as we give entirely of ourselves, together.

Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist

"Contemplation is a gaze of faith, fixed on Jesus. 'I look at him and he looks at me': this is what a certain peasant of Ars used to say to his holy cure (St. Jean Vianney) about his prayer before the tabernacle."

My wife Stacey and I had the blessed fortune of attending the National Eucharistic Congress(along with roughly 60,000 of our closest Catholic friends) which was held July 17-21 in Indianapolis. It began with the opening procession from the four pilgrimage routes on Wednesday and ended with a Mass on Sunday attended by over 1,000 priests including around 150 bishops. What an incredible and uplifting week we were



blessed with. On opening night the crowd spent 45+ silent minutes on their knees (in a football stadium no less) in Adoration. Each night concluded with a fabulous group of speakers and at least 30-45 minutes in Adoration in Lucas Oil Stadium. It was so inspiring to see so many faithful of all ages kneeling in a football stadium in silence while the blessed sacrament was exposed. If the concluding session in Lucas Oil Stadium wasn't enough there was always the Perpetual Adoration Chapel at St. John the Evangelist Church across the street from the Indiana Convention Center, where Stacey and I spent a few evenings. Depending on the time of day, you might find a line to get into the Perpetual Adoration Chapel. While each person was there for different reasons, we all shared the same purpose; to draw strength from Jesus our Savior present in the Blessed Sacrament. There was never any doubt in any attendee's mind that the Blessed Sacrament was the real and true presence of Jesus, which is the source and summit of our faith as we discussed last week.

I witnessed the strength and power of spending that time in Adoration, me and Jesus, just asking Jesus to show me who He was. I am looking forward to getting back to my parish and finding time and a place to spend time in Adoration. Of all the great thoughts and ideas about Jesus' Presence in the Eucharist, one I will remember as I attend Mass is that Jesus gives us the gift of Himself, so we should give Him the gift of our presence. Sometimes we can be distracted at Mass (and Adoration) but Jesus was sent by the Father to be given to all; as Catholics we believe Jesus is truly present in the bread and wine; we should take full advantage of this to develop a personal relationship with Him.

Am I really present to the presence of Christ in the Eucharist? What keeps me from experiencing this intimacy with God at Mass? – *Chris Bergman*










EPIC August Event
