TOGETHER

As we dive into the third year of the Eucharistic Revival, let us reinvigorate our participation at Mass and invite those who have wandered from our fold to return. Join us these next five weeks as we reflect on key components of the Mass and pray that our worship may be pleasing to God in Heaven as we give entirely of ourselves, together.

Sunday: Day of the Lord

"To lose a sense of Sunday as the Lord's Day, a day to be sanctified, is symptomatic of the loss of an authentic sense of Christian freedom, the freedom of the children of God. Sunday thus appears as the primordial holy day, when all believers, wherever they are found, can become heralds and guardians of the true meaning of time. It gives rise to the Christian meaning of life and a new way of experiencing time, relationships, work, life and death." -Sacrosanctam Concilium #73



It's kind of fun to think about all the different places I've experienced Sunday Mass: in the middle of the woods on the mountains of New Hampshire during a college retreat, in a ranch style house turned chapel in Flagstaff, Arizona, and even in my parents' basement during Easter 2020 with my uncle who is a priest. I'm sure that you and your family have some similar experiences! Notably, however, one of the most interesting Sunday Mass moments I've ever had took place two years ago in Seaside Heights, New Jersey. "Are you girls here for a sports tournament?" a kind older lady asked my best friend as she looked at the pew full of twenty-somethings. "Nope," she replied with a smile, "we're on a Bachelorette weekend for our friend and most of us are Catholic." The lady looked both humored and satisfied with her response, and I couldn't help but thank God in that moment for the faith and friendship of that group.

What connects these stories, and why am I sharing them? Are they to emphasize how amazing it is that we can travel all over the country and world and find the same celebration of the Mass? Are they to reinforce how important faith-filled family and friends are in helping you live according to the guidelines of the Church? All these hypotheses are true, but the most sincere answer is one which connects directly to the quote we see inscribed above in Sacrosanctum Concilium. Pope Paul VI says through attending Sunday Mass regularly we, among many other things, become the "heralds and guardians of the true meaning of time." To paraphrase, this weekly hour keeps our lives contextualized within and focused upon what our true end is in the Catholic life: to experience the beatific vision of Heaven and live united with God forever. Each and every one of us is endlessly busy with a long list of events and "to dos" which both bring us tremendous joy and consume our energy in positive and negative ways. Our presence at Sunday Mass is a weekly Easter, giving us an abundant opportunity for recognition of and thanksgiving for what God has done for us in the past, how He is here with us in the present, and where He will continue to lead us in the future. But as Paul IV notes, Sunday Mass doesn't just allow us to be "guardians" but "heralds". This means that our regular attendance at Mass becomes a witness for others. How powerfully it speaks to our family, friends, and community about the importance of devotion to God when we not only forego activities that conflict with our ability to gather for Mass on Sundays but also when we take joyful experiences, like vacations, out of town athletic tournaments, or even the occasional Bachelorette party, and give God his due worship through it all? And furthermore, how much more can it speak to our freedom from what are truly lesser attachments in the world in order to pursue that relationship with the Lord which is most important. As life inevitably gets busy as we begin this fall, let us challenge ourselves to be, as Pope Paul VI says, "guardians and heralds" through our celebration of each Sunday.

How do I and my family honor Sunday as the Lord's Day, both with regard to our attendance of Mass and the activities of the entire day? – *Haley Metzger*

Service Opportunity ... for some Simple Sewing







Elderly and Homebound Ministry






