

TOGETHER


As we dive into the third year of the Eucharistic Revival, let us reinvigorate our participation at Mass and invite those who have wandered from our fold to return. Join us these next five weeks as we reflect on key components of the Mass and pray that our worship may be pleasing to God in Heaven as we give entirely of ourselves, together.

Obligation: Law and Love

"Even if in the earliest times it was not judged necessary to be prescriptive, the Church has not ceased to confirm this obligation of conscience, which rises from the inner need felt so strongly by the Christians of the first centuries. It was only later, faced with the half-heartedness or negligence of some, that the Church had to make explicit the duty to attend Sunday Mass..." -Pope St. John Paul II



I want to pose a challenging question to begin this week's reflection: if you didn't have to go to Mass each Sunday, would you? If, perhaps, there was a removal of obligation by the very letter of the law and any consequential guilt you felt at filling your Sunday morning or Saturday evening with something else was eradicated, would your choices be any different? I think if we're each completely honest with ourselves, we have to acknowledge that the obligatory element to Sunday Mass does play a role in why we attend. Certainly, the degree can vary and we may even find ourselves quite alive and on fire for singing, reading the Sacred Scriptures, and receiving our Lord in the Eucharist most weekends, but every once and a while I think it's fair to say that attending Mass "because we should" is all the reason we can muster.



Our world today has become particularly suspicious of the ways in which our freedom can be "limited". Laws and restrictions of any kind are to be scrutinized, particularly if they cause us to be inconvenienced in some fashion. But it seems to me, and I am aware that this is not a revolutionary thought, that this approach also appears to validate a philosophy rooted in ego and selfishness. It presumes that a) I know what is best for me and b) I have every right to pursue that end. I'm sure that we can all reflect on our own life experiences to see how this two-fold mantra fails time and time again. I won't say that it isn't good to have a diligence to understand the implications of laws, particularly if they are being proposed in society's legal system, but the Church's teaching on Mass attendance on Sundays (and Holy Days of Obligation) is a perfect example of how law itself can and should

work for our true good. As our Creator who formed us in our uniqueness and knows how to support our ultimate flourishing, God alone understands our deepest needs and how Mass on Sundays satisfies that which we most deeply hunger for: perfect communion with Him. God has created within us this yearning that can only be satisfied with His Body and Blood in the Eucharist, and the obligation to join this table at Mass should be compared to our obligation to hydrate and feed ourselves at meals throughout the day: both are truly necessary for our nourishment. We can choose to do otherwise in our free will, but rather than thrive we will inevitably begin to starve. The Church then, in her charity for every soul, holds us accountable so that we don't wander off and mistake falsities for that which can truly satisfy us.

In reading this quote from the great St. John Paul II, I'm also struck by another question: how much does it pain the Sacred Heart of our Lord to know that each of us may continually come to Mass not because we want to unite ourselves in love of Him but because we feel we have to? There is rejoicing, no doubt, when each of us gathers in our churches each Sunday, and it is true that doing something out of obligation doesn't mean it isn't done out of love. Often, it is quite the opposite! But just like every wife wants her husband to want to accompany her on an errand or do the dishes, our Lord desires this same movement of our hearts toward Him.

What are the reasons I'm coming to Mass every week? How can I continue to shift my mindset, recognizing my need for Christ and Christ's desire for me and my love?




Service Opportunity ... for some Simple Sewing
