


















# The Cross of Jesus & EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

The Cross of Jesus Christ is arguably the most recognizable religious symbol in the world. The physical manifestation of God's love for humanity through his self-sacrifice. It is a most beautiful contradiction that Christ's lowest moment, His passion and death, serves as our greatest reminder of him. But why do we venerate a wooden cross when we Catholics possess the Eucharist, the Son of Man Himself?


In 326, Roman Emperor Constantine's mother, Helena, traveled on a pilgrimage to Jerusalem. She destroyed two pagan temples which stood at Calvary and the site of Jesus' tomb. Tradition maintains that St. Helena discovered three wooden crosses there. St. Helena brought a sick woman to the crosses, and when she touched all three, the one that healed her was declared the True Cross. St. Helena then commissioned the Church of the Holy Sepulchre to be built on this spot, which remains there to this day.

St. Helena was able to see so clearly what so many of us often struggle to realize: the Cross of Christ is the most valuable relic in all of Christendom because it represents the summit of God's love for mankind. Upon the Cross, Christ died so that His

very substance—His body, blood, soul, and divinity—might echo throughout all of time and save all mankind. Each time the Eucharist is presented, we are witnessing that same Crucifixion. In a time when pagan gods boasted great deeds of violence, conquest, and glorification, St. Helena built a monument to the God who emptied Himself, taking the form of a slave, humbled Himself, and became obedient to death, even death on a Cross.

Relics of the True Cross, most a mere splinter, are scattered throughout the world at various holy sites. Yet the True Cross is also with us every time we come before the presence of Christ in the Eucharist, particularly during Forty Hours Devotion. The number forty represents the idea of repentance or preparation. Consider the forty days of Noah in the Ark, the forty years of Israel wandering in the desert, or the forty days Christ spent in the desert. Churches host forty hours of Eucharistic Adoration as a call to Christians to come before the Eucharist, Christ on the Cross, to repent and prepare their souls. All Christians can feel far from God at times. But remember the actions of St. Helena and seek the True Cross. You will find it in the Eucharist and in the veneration of the most Holy Cross, the instrument of all salvation.

Keep watch with our Lord for one hour. Commit yourself to time at Forty Hours Devotion at Saint Cecilia this weekend.




#### **Elderly and Homebound Ministry**

#### **Baptismal Garments**




