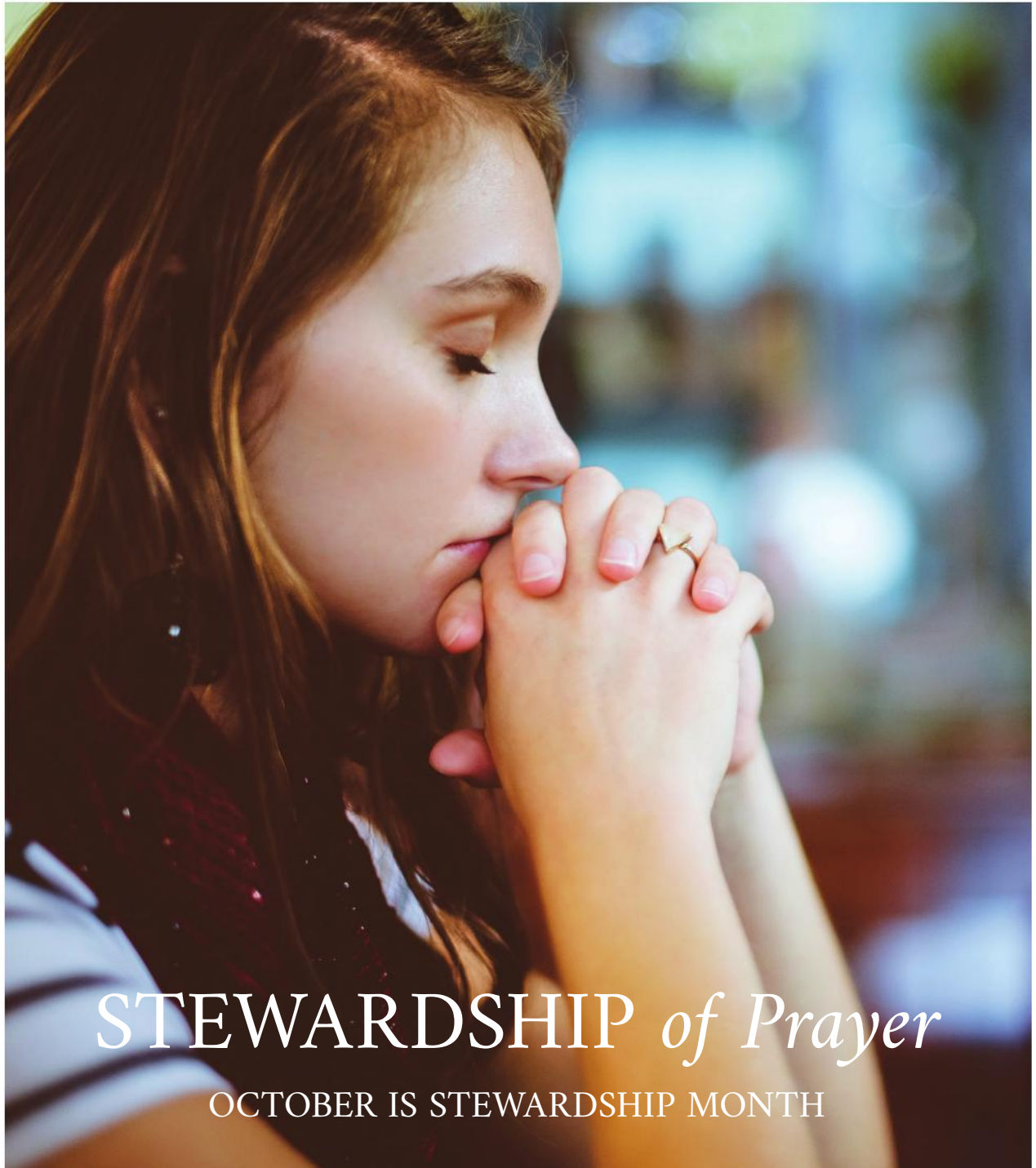

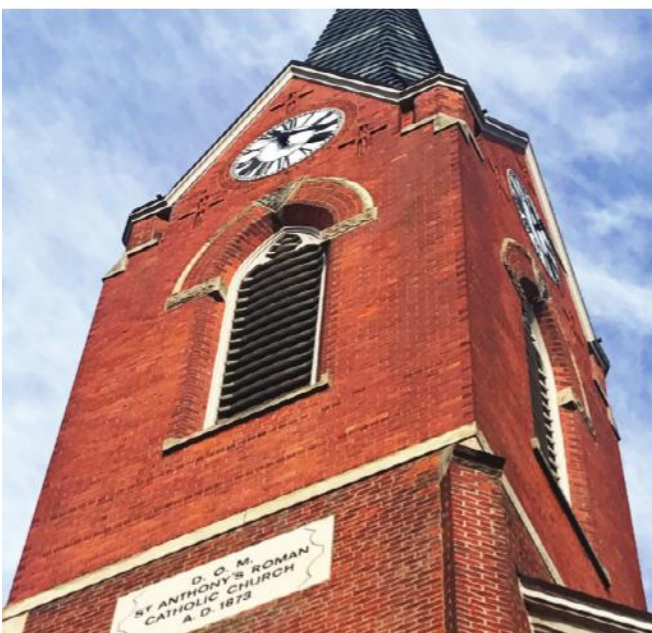

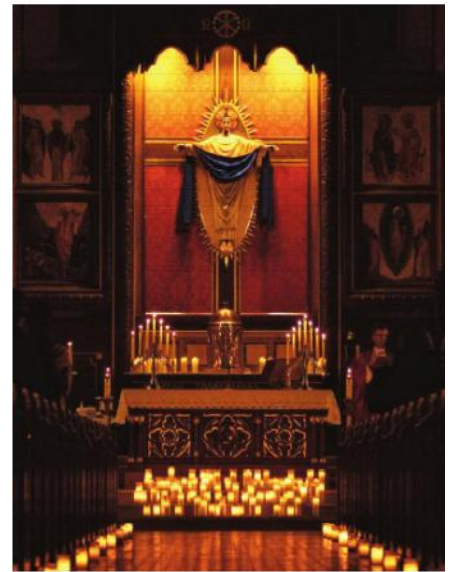

STEWARDSHIP MONTH: *Stewardship of Prayer*

With the arrival of October, we begin Stewardship Month. This week, we are highlighting Stewardship of Prayer. God is all worthy of the worship and praise we bestow upon Him. As we concentrate on our prayer life, let us continue looking to Jesus that we may keep Him as the center of our lives and never drift apart. Usually when we drift away from Christ, it is the result of indifference. It's not that we wilfully reject Jesus, but in order to really focus on our prayer life, we have to accept that worshipping Him can be hard when the world is still moving forward around us. 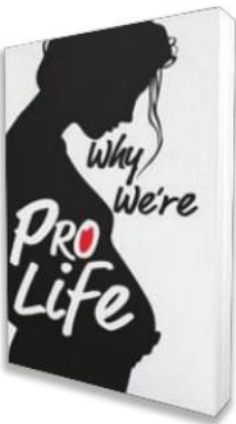

We Are Pro-Life

I recently heard a prominent pro-lifer refer to abortion as a demonic parody of the Eucharist in an interview clip that came across my radar. Struck by this strong assertion, I leaned in, eager to hear his evidence for his argument. He went on to explain the significance of the rallying cry of the pro-abortion movement: "my body, my choice." "It's no coincidence," he says, "that the central phrase of the entire abortion industrial complex and the culture of death today are the same words of our Savior at the First Communion: this is my body". He elaborates, however, that rather than Christ's sacrifice, which involves the total offering of His own body out of love for the redeemed life of his creation, abortion's sacrifice is that which renounces created life for the sake of oneself. To rephrase, "This is my body, which I will not give up for you." As God's adversary, it is completely reasonable that Satan would desire to not simply destroy God's greatest and most beloved creation, human beings, but also attempt to blaspheme the sacrament whereby God expresses the depth of the love He has for them.



As Trent Horn writes in *Why We're Pro-Life*, there are circumstances surrounding abortion that can perhaps make us question whether it is ever justified or should be legal. Perhaps you yourself struggle with this issue. However, as he

affirms and as the reflection above makes clear, when we delve into the fundamental question of "are the unborn human beings", to which the answer is unequivocally yes, we can't help but come face to face with the designs of the evil one. As Catholics we are called to staunchly defend the dignity of human life, and we will be dedicating this Respect Life month to spotlighting some key ways through which it is most significantly under attack. We encourage you to take a copy of *Why We're Pro-Life*, located at the doors this weekend, and use it in your ongoing efforts to understand and evangelize why we are pro-life. Please also continue to offer up your prayers for the defense of all life during this special month and consider witnessing to those in our community during the 40 Days for Life campaign, signups for which can be found by scanning the QR code at right. - *Haley Metzger*



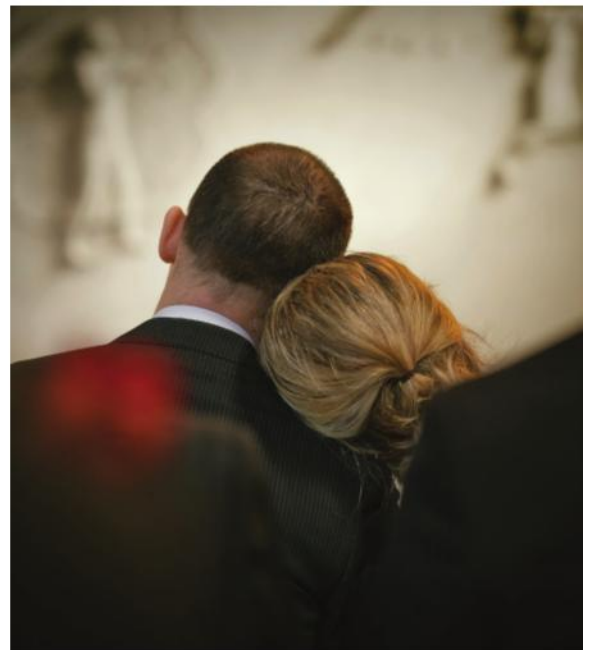
Cocktails with the Catechism Encounter Jesus...At the Movies?

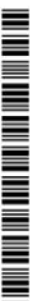


UPCOMING EVENTS

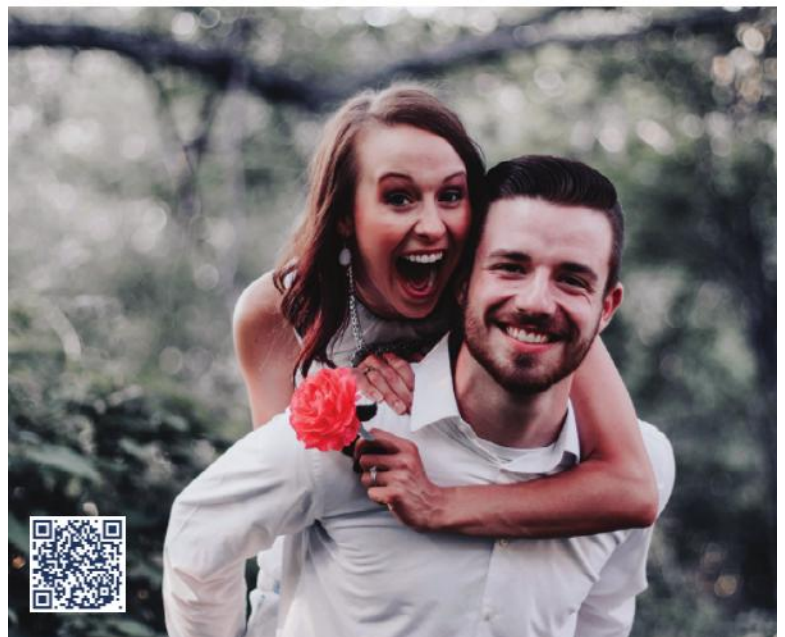

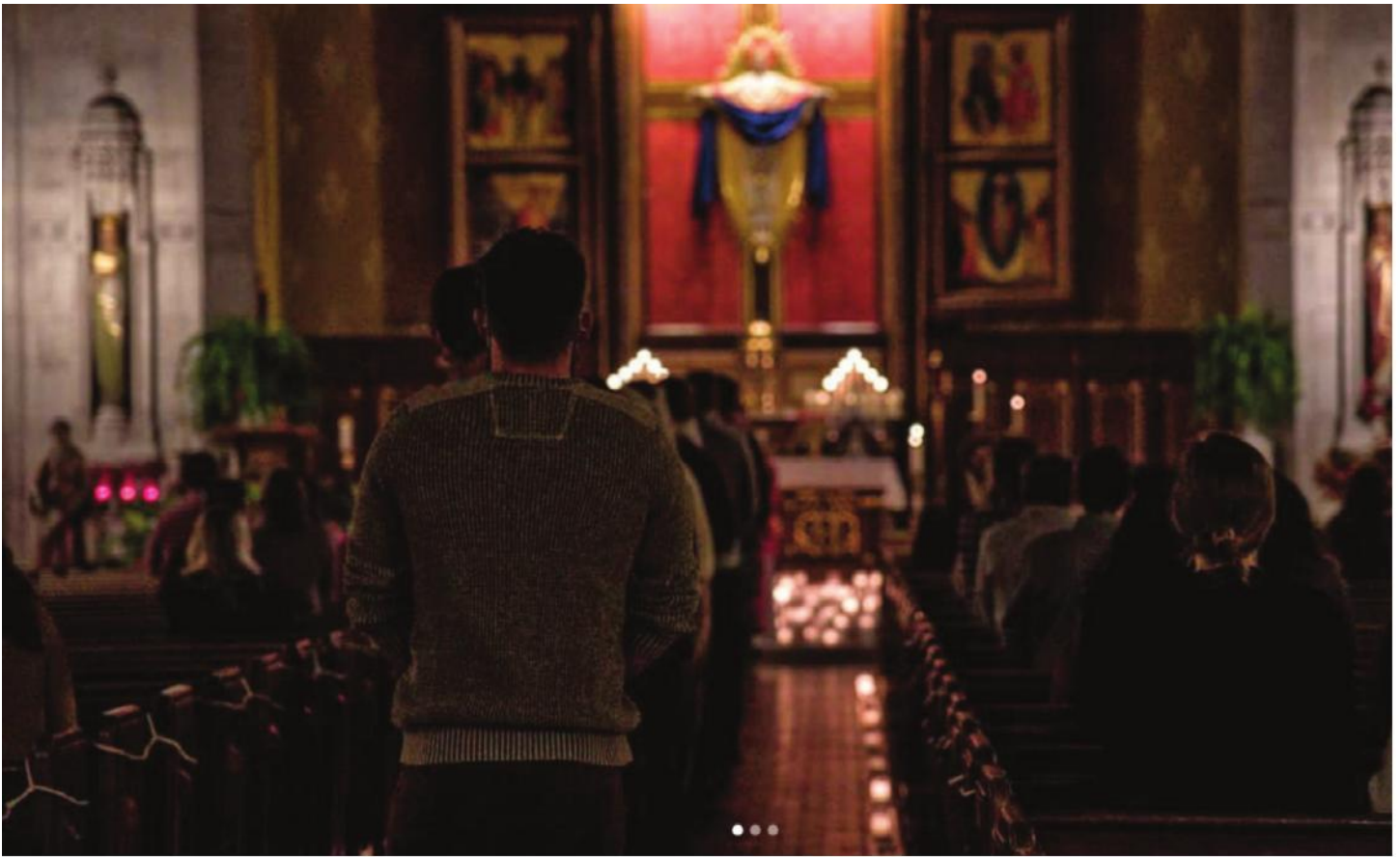
