"You Go Into the Vineyard, Too..." by Haley Metzger

One of the most enduring works that powerfully underscores stewardship of ministry is Chrisifideles Laeci, or "Christ's Faithful Laity", an apostolic exhortation written by Pope St. John Paul II in 1988. In it, JP II uses the scriptural parable of the laborers in the vineyard to illuminate the role and importance of everyday men and women in the mission of the Church. Found in the twentieth chapter of the Gospel of Matthew, the parable begins with a master who instructs hired laborers to go out into his vineyard and tend to its fruit. As the day goes on, he discovers more and more individuals who are ready and willing to assist him. Eventually, several hours later, there is still more work to be done, prompting him to deliver the line that John Paul Il wishes to highlight: "you go into the vineyard, too" (Matthew 20:7). It seems to be a simple, even a throwaway line, yet our beloved Polish pope unearths a rich new understanding of it and its applicability to our lives. As the master in this parable continues to find himself in need of more hands to properly support the flourishing of his vineyard, so does our God call each one of us to participate in attending to the work of His harvest: the Church.


Oftentimes, we can be tempted to believe that each of us in the laity are neither called nor equipped for the Church's mission of ministry.

But Chrisifideles Laeci both refutes this thought and galvanizes us for this challenge. "The call is a concern not only of Pastors, clergy, and men and women religious. The call is addressed to everyone: lay people as well are personally called by the Lord, from whom they receive a mission on behalf of the Church and the world." When we reflect further on why this is we not only come to the conclusion that the work is simply too great to be attended to solely by those called to religious life but, furthermore, the growing challenges of secularization and skepticism of faith can often create spaces and communities which the laity may have greater ability to access.

As we reflect this Sunday on stewardship of ministry, let each of us reflect on this resounding line of "you go into the vineyard, too" and how it stirs us to embrace our share in the mission of the Church. How has God created us with our gifts and talents to be uniquely suited for some role in His plan? What time has He given us to dedicate to the building up of His Kingdom? Perhaps some of us have already felt the call to serve in some way within our family and we have begun this mission. But if not, let your heart hear these words of the Master today, for the harvest is, indeed, great, and what the Church needs in laborers are certainly more than a few.

A Culture of Life

As we examine the issue of abortion in the modern world, perhaps one of the greatest temptations is to believe that there is nowhere for women experiencing an unplanned pregnancy to turn for assistance. When we look around our own community, we have a myriad of organizations that work diligently to provide every level of support a mother may need as she chooses life. Mater Filius House, for example, welcomes in women who may not have a place to live. As they continue to prepare for the birth of their child, they are able to live in community with other expectant mothers, learn how to cook and care for their baby, receive coaching and professional development, and cultivate a life of prayer. On our own side of Cincinnati, Pregnancy Center Plus continues to empower women to embrace each new life and equip them with everything that they need from both a material and personal perspective: parent education classes, baby supplies, life coaching, financial planning, and ultrasounds, just to name a few. These incredible groups rely on the generosity of the community to continue to make abortion unthinkable in the minds of our young people. This weekend, we invite you to take one of the baby bottles at the entrances of the church and fill them up throughout the month of October. Remember, each time you drop a few coins or dollars into it, you are helping a mom from Hyde Park, Oakley, or Madisonville in making the heroic choice to embrace God's beautiful gift of new life. These bottles can be returned on the weekend of November 3rd at each location. Thank you for your support in not just making abortion illegal but unthinkable in our community!

October 26: Young Adult Bonfire Night with Deacon Nathan & Family


