
"Are you kidding me!?!?"

This was Scott's, a young father and husband struggling to make ends meet, reaction as the teacher of his church's budgeting class just told him he needed to be tithing 10%. Week after week, Scott kept coming to class, even bringing his bills to show the teacher that if the church got 10%, somebody else wasn't getting paid. Week after week, his teacher insisted that Scott tithe.

God obviously does not need our money, but this teacher understood tithing is not about giving God our money! Rather, tithing is about giving him our trust. Money represents our work, our control, our safety. In tithing, we relinquish all these things to God, trusting him to be a good Father who will take care of us. Look at the story of Jesus's temptation in the desert. The devil offered power and security. Jesus, tired, hungry, and aching, responds by trusting his Father to provide.

Scott kept going to those classes, and he finally took up the advice of his teacher. To call the results shocking would be an understatement. He watched miracles happen, seeing checks come in worth the exact amount he needed that month. As he continued to tithe, he saw the tangible results of God providing for him. Having given God his money, he began giving his time, and ultimately his heart. Scott began praying as he never had before, not in begging God to help this month, but talking to him as a boy talks to his dad.

I am so thankful for the decision Scott made, because as my dad began putting Christ at the center of his life, he began putting Christ at the center of our family's life. In deciding to tithe, my dad learned to love Jesus and to have faith in him - a faith he instilled in me as a child. Like everything we do in the Church, being stewards of our finances is primarily about our relationship with God, the Father who gives us everything. Make the commitment to tithe, and watch how the Lord shows his provision in your life.

IVF...God's Catch 22?

A couple experiencing the cross of infertility often feels this way; "God wants marriages to be fruitful, yet he won't allow us to be." "The Lord says over and over, ask and you shall receive, yet we do not receive." Worst of all, the couple is crushed by the fact that there are millions of unwanted children killed in their mother's wombs, while the infertile couple would give several limbs just to have one born of theirs.

They visit the fertility clinic and the doctor gives them hope! Science can now (almost) guarantee a child through IVF. To the infertile couple, this is an answered prayer! Only to find that their own Church tells them IVF is illicit. Is God making us infertile only to deny us this means of fertility? There are manifold moral implications to IVF. Perhaps the most important is that IVF and abortion are intrinsically related. We cannot oppose abortion and support IVF. The IVF process creates many more embryos than it uses, the surplus of which are often stored, used for research, or ultimately, destroyed. It is not fundamentally different than using a pill or an IUD to abort a new embryo in a mother's womb. In their emotional strife, the couple is tempted to rationalize or overlook these evils to bring about a seemingly greater good, a new life.

But what about the spiritual problem? There is a difference between receiving a gift from God and taking one from Him. Obedience to His plan means more suffering for some than for others, as Our Lord teaches us from the Cross. Yet, if we trust in His plan, and in His goodness, he will always have something better in store for us than we can imagine for ourselves. And the infertile couple can rationalize, "yes, and that good is IVF!" But it is not. If the Church teaches us that it is wrong, God is not separately telling us that it isn't. Those temptations are from the devil. Consider, the Lord may use the cross of infertility as the way to draw a couple closer to Him. And there is no greater good, not even the bearing of children, than to be closer to Our Lord.




