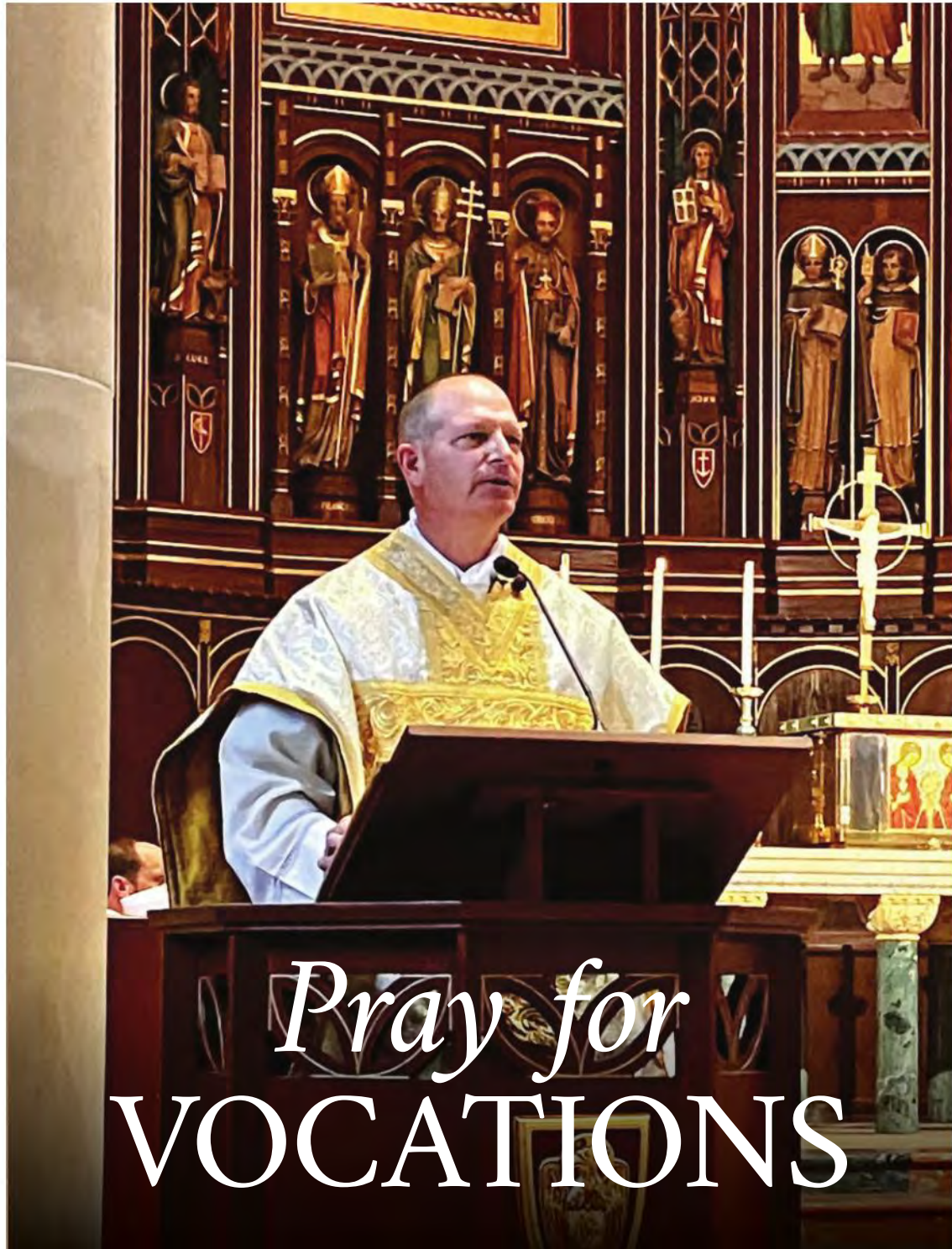

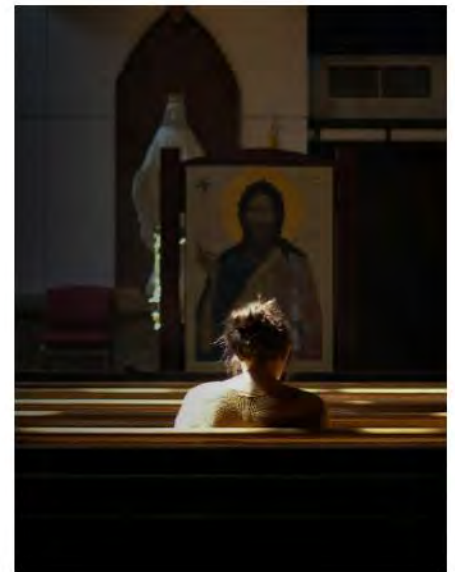

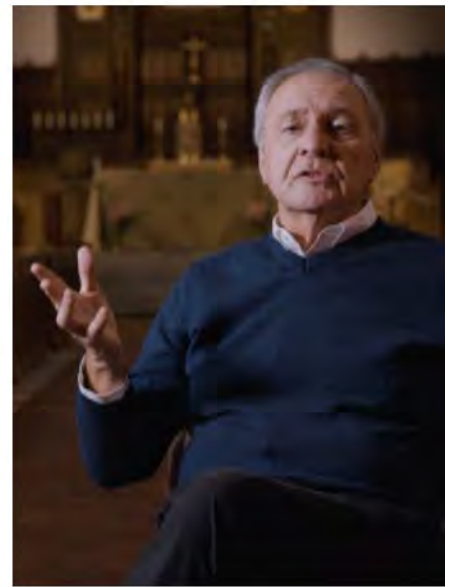

National Vocations Week

This week is National Vocations Awareness Week! This week we celebrate and share awareness and we pray for those who have dedicated their lives through priesthood, diaconate, and consecrated life to serve the Lord.

This year we had many exciting and moving moments at our Eucharistic Revival Procession. We took the Lord out to the streets and made everyone aware of His Real Presence. The Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith. Without priests, there is no Eucharist. That beautiful procession with all of the different priests carrying the monstrance would have never happened. We continually need prayers for our priests and for those who are discerning the priesthood. When I talk to my brother priests I see how hard it is for them to handle the many churches they are in charge of pastoring right now. We are all grateful for our vicars who assist us in the many tasks we are asked to do each day. Still, we know the need for more priests is a problem and we must continue to pray and ask God to guide the men that are being called to answer that call.

Dress for Success

The most significant way to explore a vocation is to act on it. For this reason, altar serving has always functioned as an apprenticeship to the priesthood. Serving the Mass gave young boys the opportunity to be near the altar so they could watch the priest closely as he prayed the Mass. They dressed like the priest, prayed with the priest, and assisted the priest during Mass. They could see what the priest did and how he lived his life, discerning whether this might be the life the Lord was calling them to. As the Church began to allow girls to serve, they too could use altar serving to discern whether the Lord was calling them to a religious vocation.

Anyone who has achieved much success in life will tell you to dress for the part you want to play. For this reason, we are upgrading the vestments for our servers at St. Mary's. In an effort to help foster vocations within our family, the boys will start wearing cassocks and surplices like priests, and girls will have vestments like the habits of religious sisters. We will also have sets of black dress shoes for them to wear. These changes serve as a small way our children can act on a call to which God is leading them.

Discernment

Unveiled

How to Move Forward
When God Seems Silent

"Lord, just tell me what you want me to do, and I'll do it."

Everyone who has taken time to discern their vocation has invariably found themselves asking this question. Discernment can be difficult. It's hard to understand why God doesn't always make it clear. Ultimately, we find ourselves looking for our "St. Paul moment," when God bursts forth from the clouds, shouting, "You will be a priest!"

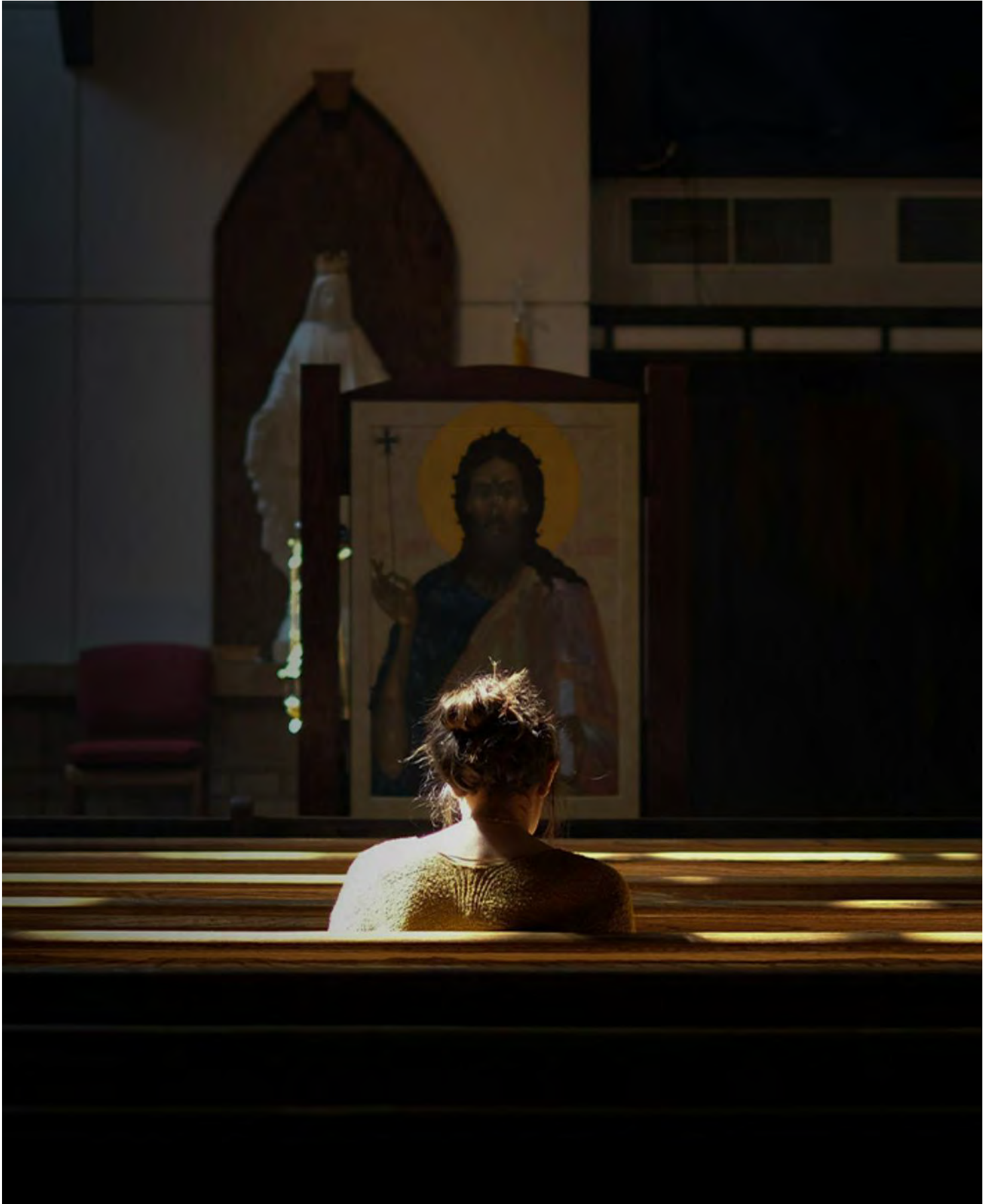
But let's dissect that St. Paul encounter a bit. St. Paul was a Pharisee, a son of a Pharisee, brought up "at the feet of Gamaliel, educated according to the strict manner of the law of our fathers, being zealous for God (Acts 22:3)." Repeatedly in Acts and his letters, Paul defends his Jewish background, showing that no one was a better, law-abiding Jew than him. Even before his conversion, Paul did everything intending to serve God. Unfortunately, what he was doing was killing Christians, obviously not part of God's will. So, due to the drastic nature of how wrong Paul was, God had to speak loudly to help flip him 180°.

Now, the takeaway is not to begin following a path obviously against God's will. Remember, Paul honestly thought he was

doing the work of God! But he also was praying and communicating with the Lord, even if he wasn't hearing clearly. The first step of discernment is simply to talk to God. Don't even talk to him about your discernment. Just talk to him. Form a relationship with him. Let your basis of prayer not be the question, "What do you want me to do?" but just the fact that you love the Lord.

The next point is key. Act! Do something. So many of us tend to wait for God to tell us what to do while sitting around in a self-made purgatory. Instead, if you think there's a potential God has called you to the priesthood or religious life, go for it. Remember, God cares more about you being happy than even you do. He's your Father, and he's looking out for you. If you remain in a relationship with him, he will close the doors of the places he's not calling you to. Nobody ends up in the wrong vocation because God wasn't speaking to them.

That's all discernment is: pray, act, and keep praying. As we keep moving, God will nudge us or, like St. Paul, occasionally pick us up and turn us around. But he will guide us. We need only to trust him enough to act.

On Sunday, October 20th, we were able to recognize just under 50 men and women who have declared their intention to enter into full communion with the Catholic Church. They are in the process of completing the Church's program called O.C.I.A., or Order of Christian Initiation of Adults and are aspiring to complete their Sacraments of Initiation this coming Easter Vigil. Throughout the year, most of them will meet weekly for group catechesis and conversation, where they will study the Church's teachings on everything from the Trinity, to the sacraments, to moral issues all while simultaneously being formed in the heart and habits of a disciple. 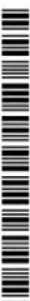

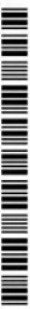

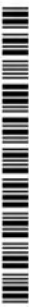
