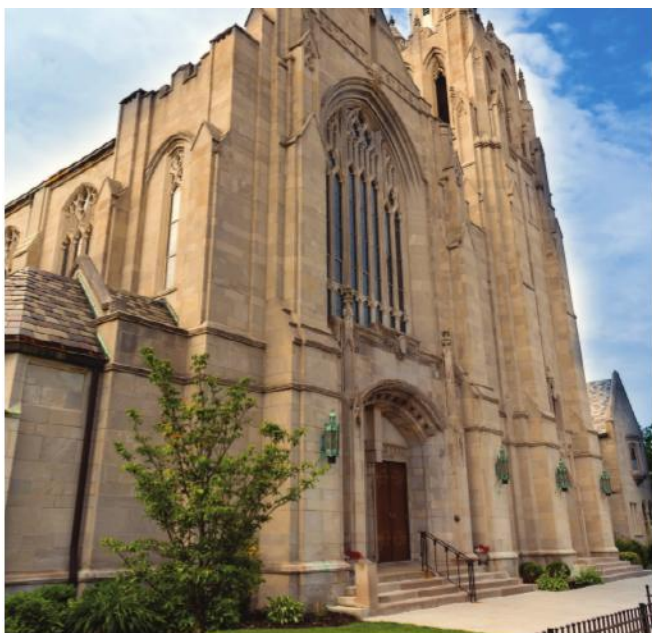

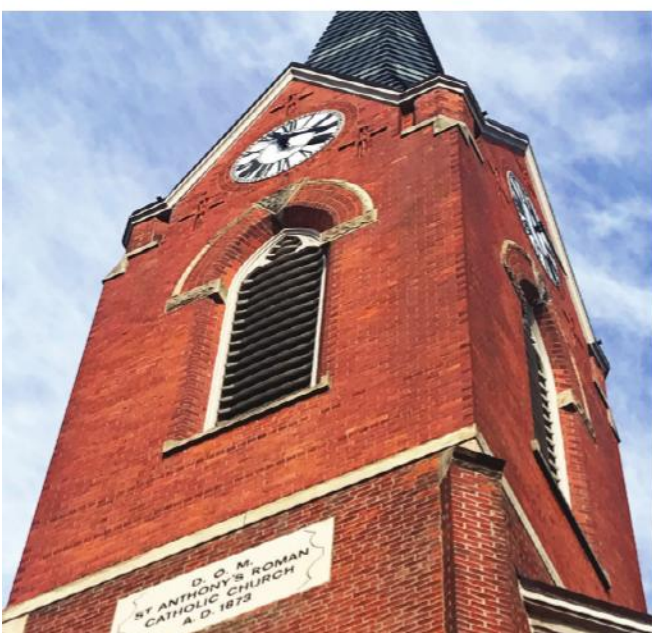

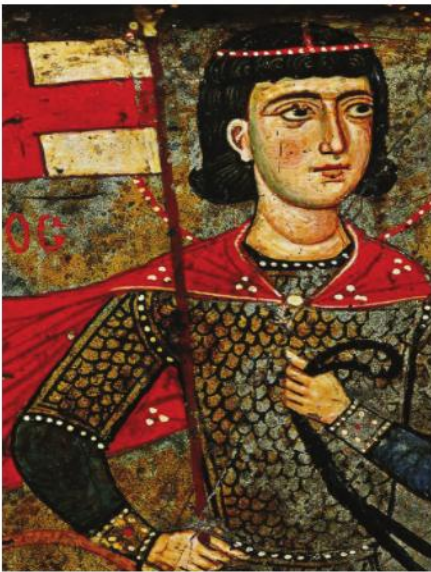

Veterans' Day

This week we honor the veterans who sacrificed so much to defend our country. As we enter this month and prepare for Together Sunday on the Feast of Christ the King, let us think about the veterans and their families and express our gratitude for their sacrifices. One way we can do this is by inviting them to Mass and praying for them. If a veteran you know is away from their family send them a holy card with a prayer of gratitude and protection. Invite the family to Mass and have them over for lunch. It's a wonderful way to spend a weekend truly showing how much their sacrifice means to you.

Another way to honor this day is by reading books about military chaplains that served as soldiers. Two books that are highly recommended are *The Grunt Padre* and *The Miracle of Fr. Emil Kapuan: Priest, Soldier, Korean War Hero*. Both Fr. Vincent Capodanno and Fr. Kapuan are Servants of God which is the first of four levels to sainthood. Please keep our military chaplains in your prayers as they stand in the frontlines of war and its effects. They are the ones that hold the wounds of combat, some visible and some invisible.

Black Catholic History Month

Born December 29, 1937, in Yazoo City, Mississippi, Sister Thea Bowman was reared as a Protestant until age nine when she asked her parents if she could become a Catholic. Gifted with a brilliant mind, beautiful voice, and dynamic personality, Sister Thea shared the message of God's love through a teaching career. After 16 years of teaching at the elementary, secondary, and university levels, she was invited by the bishop of Jackson, Mississippi, to become the consultant for intercultural awareness.

In her role as consultant Sister Thea, an African American, gave presentations across the country; lively gatherings that combined singing, gospel preaching, prayer and storytelling. Her programs were directed to break down racial and cultural barriers. She encouraged people to communicate with one another so that they could understand other cultures and races.

In 1984, Sister Thea was diagnosed with breast cancer. She prayed "to live until I die." The U.S. bishops endorsed the sainthood cause of Sister Thea Bowman on November 14, 2018.

RELIQS

Powerful Reminders and Conduits of Aid

In the spring of 2018, I returned home from a college spring break trip with an album filled with pictures of all the sights from Florence, Italy. Among the shots of the David and the world's best cannoli, perhaps the most impactful photos I was able to share with my family and friends were the ones of the relics contained in the Medici Chapel. I swiped by countless images of reliquaries holding the bones of St. John the Baptist, St. Peter, the True Cross, and even the thorns from Christ's crown of crucifixion. My Dad's reaction, at first emphatic, soon transformed to a silent smile brimming with tears. I had known my father to cry at "It's a Wonderful Life" or choral music but never necessarily the faith. What was it about these relics that moved him so deeply?

I think that for many people, relics are a way by which we are reminded of the reality of the story of our faith. When we see the thorns from Christ's crown or the True Cross we have a tangible piece of evidence that all that we have been told is true. When I had the chance on that same trip to see the head of St. Catherine in her hometown of Siena, and then pray before the rest of her body in Santa Maria Sopra Minerva in Rome, she could no longer be just this holy woman I came to love through literature, a mere character. She was flesh and bone, right in front of my eyes!

Notwithstanding relics' abilities to convict hearts by their mere presence, perhaps one of their most storied reputations is also their ability to be a conduit of the power of God. Just as contact with Elisha's bones resurrect a man in the second book of Kings, the remains of the saints have been a way by which God can heal. Only last year we were host to the arm of St. Jude, a relic which is documented in the miraculous recovery of cancer patients, sick newborns, and those experiencing both physical and spiritual challenges. But it is important to point out that relics should be viewed as "magic" or a compulsion of God to act a certain way. Rather they are an avenue by which our faith in the Lord and love for Him through reverencing his holy followers can bring about very real intervention and transformation in our lives.

We are blessed in our family to have an abundance of first-class relics which are on display for veneration. Notably, we also happen to have a second-class relic, the kitchen chair of St. John Vianney, where this patron saint of priests used to hear countless confessions of different penitents. As we reflect this month upon all those who have passed on from this world and pray for their souls, let us also call to mind the very real intercession of the saints, the gift that their relics are to our faith, and the myriad of ways by which God can continue to bring healing to our world.

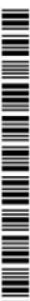

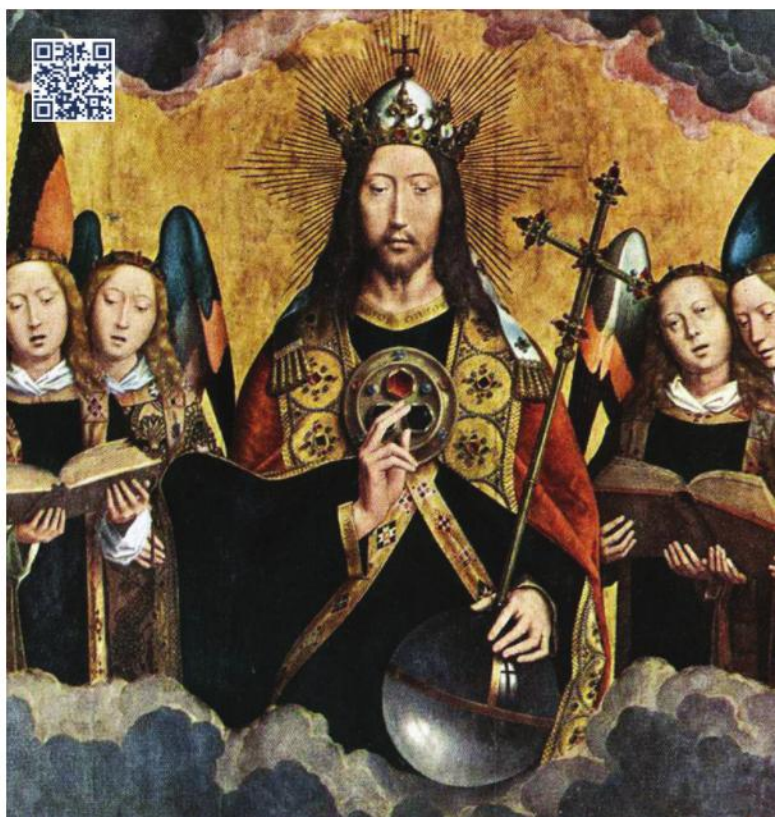


Cocktails with the Catechism Encounter Jesus...King of Kings

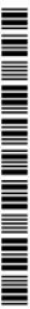
