Black Catholic History Month

Did you know that the patron saint of southern Germany and parts of France, Spain, Italy, and Switzerland, is a man of African origin?

He is Saint Maurice of Aganaum, born less than 250 years after Jesus Christ. He became a general in the Roman army, stationed in what is now France. Saint Maurice and his six thousand African soldiers were ordered to put down a rebellion against the empire. When Saint Maurice discovered they all were Christians, he and his men refused to fight their fellow Christians. They also refused to sacrifice to the Roman gods. For this, the emperor had Saint Maurice and nearly all of his Theban Legion executed. A basilica in Aganaum, Switzerland enshrines their relic remains today.

# CHRIST the KING



As mere Earthly creatures, we are imperfect, and thus we are in need of great guidance. No one would deny this, even those who doubt the existence of the Divine. Kings once provided security in exchange for loyalty and devotion. In our increasingly democratic society today, the idea of allowing oneself to be ruled leaves a bad taste in our mouths. The sin of pride has made us prone to believe that there is no authority higher than the self, and thus we rebel against rule. Yet the righteous king does not rule selfishly, but leads out of a deep, selfless love for his people.

This is the King that we worship; One who leads, Who provides guidance, but does not manipulate or use force. Christ is the King of Kings, and what may seem like rule is, in fact, the gentle guidance of a loving Father. Our King, our Father, demands for tribute only that we honor Him. The fourth commandment directs us to remember the Sabbath by keeping it holy. As Catholics, we understand this not as a suggestion, but as a command. Attending Mass is not optional; it is an obligation.

Yet in His all-knowing goodness and all-powerful love, God commands this out of love, not self-interest. Outside of the Mass, there is no superior source of grace, no greater good, no more direct access to God. It is in the Mass alone where Jesus enters our lives, body, blood, soul, and divinity, in the Eucharist. During the Mass, we kneel before a King, who does not tax us for His own gain; for we are His gain. Our salvation brings Him more delight than anything else could, and this is precisely why He created us. In the same way that a loving father accepts new life because he desires to love his child, God created us so that He could love us. By going to Mass each Sunday, we renew our promise to God that we accept His great love and accept the path to salvation that He has set out for us.

There are many who consider themselves faithful followers of the King, yet they neglect this most vital experience of the Mass each Sunday. As hopeful subjects of Christ's Divine Kingship, we have a responsibility to bring others before His Holy Presence each Sunday. In the name of Christ the King, go out and call on friends and loved ones to return to the Mass. Our King is not one who seeks followers in order to grow in power, for the victory is already His. It is not for His gain that we come to Mass, but our own. Extend the invitation to others so that they too might share in the Heavenly Kingdom.
