













# MOTHER

## MOST PURE

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, remembering the special grace of purity bestowed on the Blessed Mother from the moment of her conception. Mary was created pure, free from original sin, and remained so her whole life. The miracle of the Immaculate Conception, therefore, is not only that Mary was created pure, but that she stayed pure. Eve, the first woman, was also immaculately conceived, yet she did not remain so. As we ponder the purity of Mary this day, let us remember that she was given no grace that is not available to us also. Like Mary, we too can be free from original sin through the grace of Baptism. We also carry the Lord inside of us after receiving Communion at Mass, just as Mary carried our Lord in her womb. The life of Mary is not meant to be unique, but the model for how we ought to live our lives. Mary was given purity as a free gift, but also lived in that gift her whole life. This is why we call the Church holy, not because the person in the pew next to you is perfect, but we have at least

one perfect member, Mary, who is the safeguard of the Church's holiness. Forever in Heaven, she is the guarantee that the Catholic Church is and always will be pure. And this holiness stems from her faith. Mary was faithful to the will of God perfectly in her life, from the Annunciation where she agreed to enflesh God with a human nature to the Cross where she gave him back to his Father and allowed him to be mutilated out of love for us. Her radical receptivity to the will of God was the safeguard of her purity. All of us, as children of God and Mary, are called to be like our Mother. God's desires ought to be our desires and the gift of purity that he gives to us is one that is meant to be lived out. This Feast of the Immaculate Conception, renew in your hearts the desire to be pure and enact that desire in your life through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, the triple crown of a holy life. May the Most Blessed Mother intercede for us that we may be given a desire for purity and the grace to let it envelop our entire being.
