
Pastor's Corner

The True Meaning of Christmas: Eastside Catholic's Christmas Gift

Don't forget to pick up your family's copy of *The True Meaning of Christmas: The Birth of Jesus and the Origins of the Season*! This is a fantastic read and is sure to help you unlock the scriptural foundations and cultural beginnings of favored traditions and teachings surrounding Christmas. And remember, this liturgical season lasts through January, so there is plenty of time to continue to celebrate and reflect!

Chalk Blessing

We have a tradition of having the priests bless the chalk each year so that you can write the door blessing of the Feast of the Epiphany. For this year you would write "20+C+M+B+25" over your doorpost. The numbers — 20 + 25 — signify the year. The C + M + B stands for the initials of the three Magi:Caspare, Malchior and Balthasar. The letters also stand for the Latin phrase Christus mansionem benedicat, which means "May Christ bless the house." You can pick up your chalk after Mass.

2025'S LATEST AND GREATEST CHALLENGE

The good people at Ascension are working hard. First, they released The Bible in a Year podcast in January of 2021. It didn't take long for Fr. Mike Schmitz to become one of the most internationally recognizable faces for Catholicism and millions of listeners around the world to rekindle their love of Sacred Scripture. The Bible in a Year also had an ecumenical reach and appealed to Christians of all denominations, prompting it to be nominated as one of five finalists in the iHeartRadio Podcast Awards for "Best Spirituality/Religion Podcast." In so many ways, this direction could not be more timely. When we reflect on the promises our Lady has revealed to figures like Alanus de Rupe, we can feel compelled with a particular sense of urgency! Through private revelation, our Mother has shared "The Rosary shall be a powerful armor against hell. It will destroy vice, decrease sin, and defeat heresies." We need only look around to see how this horrible trifecta has ravaged our world and threatens to divide the flock. She goes on to say "Sinners shall convert" and "The just shall persevere in grace and become worthy of eternal life." What great hope Mary gives us through these words, allowing us to become the pilgrims that this Jubilee year invites us to be.

By bringing listeners through six phases of understanding the Rosary, Fr. Mark-Mary promises to create a space where your prayer life can be transformed, nourished, and imbued with deeper intimacy with God. First listeners will begin by forming a relationship with the Blessed Mother and her Son before diving into the Biblical roots of the Rosary and mediating upon the mysteries. They will then develop the confidence to meditate based on all that they have learned, build up their routine, and join others in worldwide prayer through this devotion. While not an explicitly stated goal, an incredible aspiration would be for the faithful to pray a Rosary daily, heeding the words of our Lady in her apparition at Fatima.


St. Mary School Moms Spring Bible Study




Candlelight Mass

Our clergy will either try to help you here, or guide you toward someone who can.

However, there are times when two people have attempted marriage invalidly, have separated, and are in need of the Church's help in order to marry in the future. Catholics who are in this state do not need to refrain from the Sacraments unless they have already attempted marriage again or are in a relationship with a person other than their spouse. 


