A Prayer for the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord

O Lord, your Baptism shows us that you are not remote. You are at our side. You know sin but are not a sinner. Give us the grace to renew our baptism through a frequent reception of confession and the Holy Eucharist. By receiving one, we strengthen the others. By receiving You, we receive God Himself.

12 Days of Christmas

As Catholics we have been celebrating the Christmas season and this day marks the end of the season as we see Him start his ministry and we enter into Ordinary Time.

It can be fun researching what each of the 12 days of Christmas signifies. Take time to sing it and read about each day. On the twelfth day we sing about the twelve drummers drumming. They represent the twelve points of doctrine in the Apostles' Creed, which summarizes the core beliefs of Christianity...

The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. Hewas conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

How to celebrate the Twelfth Day of Christmas:

Say the Apostle's Creed on your own or with your family. Then have a celebration — large or small — to celebrate the close of the twelve days.


a Holy Hour at St. Cecilia at 7:00 PM that is regularly scheduled and we would like to have everyone join us in prayer for legal protection of the unborn child.
















THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Why was the baptism of Jesus so important? Why is baptism so critical to us?

To understand Jesus' mission, we need to understand that God formed a plan to save humanity from the stain of original sin. He would send a savior that would lay down his life to forgive man's sins and make a way back to heaven. This savior would show man how to have a relationship with the Father and each other. Through his resurrection, he will defeat satan, give us the Holy Spirit and open up the way to eternal life in heaven with God.


Jesus was born in Bethlehem to Mary and Joseph. There were many signs and wonders that accompanied His birth, which confirmed his incarnation and solidified the mission he would step into. He was raised in Nazareth. We hear the story of how he was lost at age 12, and then we don't hear about his life again until the introduction of John the Baptist.

John the Baptist tells of a coming savior that will baptize, not with water, but with the Holy Spirit and fire. Upon recognizing Jesus, John the Baptist announces, "Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world." Then Jesus approaches him to be baptized. John is reluctant, but Jesus


said to him in reply, "Allow it now for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness" (Mt 3:15). Once baptized, he comes up out of the water and the Spirit descends upon him like a dove and a voice from heaven said, "This is my beloved son in whom I am well pleased" (Mt 3:17b). Jesus was showing us by his example exactly how he wants us to step into our new life in Him.

When we are born, we are born with the stain of original sin. Our parents bring us to Christ to eliminate that stain. Through baptism, we are freed from original sin, adopted into God's family as sons and daughters, and He has set his seal on us through the power of the Holy Spirit in Christ. From that point on we belong to God forever. Our parents raise us to believe in God, and as we age and mature, we accept these truths and choose them for ourselves. We have been blessed this year in the Eastside Catholics Family with over 210 baptisms.

I have made many mistakes. What I know is that without God nothing is of value. I've had material things, they were empty. People are messy. Love is all that lasts. Love God and love others and your life will have meaning and be filled with many blessings. Let's do this together. Hugs from your sister in Christ!


