PROFESSING THE HOLY NAME OF JESUS

Every year when I teach the OCIA lesson "Who Is Jesus?" I lead the class in an exercise to see how many different titles for our Lord they can think of. There are always the common favorites that are shared: Prince of Peace, the Good Shepherd, King of Kings, and Lamb of God. Then there are the scripturally rich yet lesser-known ones, such as the Divine Bridegroom, the New Adam, and the Suffering Servant. It's always amazing to discover how many names our Lord has been given and the beautiful kaleidoscope of lenses they give to us on who Christ is to His people: a rescuer and redeemer, a lover, and the One who is due our utmost reverence and worship.


This conversation often leads us down another stream of thought which is the ways in which Jesus can also be misnamed, mischaracterized, and misunderstood in our world. Sometimes this can be the result of very innocent ignorance, but other times we can begin to see how Jesus has been seemingly strategically morphed into someone else. Someone more convenient for our circumstance or cause. Someone who can perhaps help placate the voice of our conscience and even mobilize a movement. Or someone who is no more than the subject of myth. This might seem like a temptation that we are removed from on an individual scale, but have we ever found ourselves in a moment of spiritual difficulty taking that internal posture of crossing our arms and uttering the words, "The Jesus I know wouldn't make me do that?"




Trent Horn engages this conversation in compelling fashion in his book *Counterfeit Christs: Finding the Real Jesus Among the Impostors.* Released last summer, Horn presents his reader with eighteen

different "phony" versions of Jesus that reflect ancient and modern errors in depicting who our Lord is. He then proceeds to skillfully untangle the truth from scriptural passages and other primary and secondary texts that have been badly misused. From start to finish, Horn's Christ types become increasingly recognizable in contemporary conversations. Beginning with reflections on the erroneous presentation of Jesus in Dan Brown's global bestseller *The DaVanci Code* and the hippie version of Jesus as the "non-judgmental buddy," he later delves into the flawed logic surrounding Jesus as a social justice hero of sorts and an Anti-Catholic Son of God who condemns all who eat the Eucharistic "death cookie", as referenced by Jack Chick

in the popular "Chick tracts." In the month dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus and in a world so often led astray by confused depictions, *Counterfeit Christs*' commitment to evangelizing the true identity of our Lord is a must read.

In the sixty years since this ecumenical council has concluded, Vatican II has become one of the most debated and divisive topics in modern Catholic conversation. Others will argue it ushered in an age where the laity could take on a greater role in serving the Church and clarified our relationship with other traditions. The most severe critics have even gone so far as to reject Vatican II's legitimacy, giving rise to the sedevacantist movement and bringing many Catholics out of communion with Rome.


