
The Sermon of the Plain

This weekend we hear the Gospel reading of the Sermon of the Plain. We hear Jesus talk about spiritual wealth versus monetary wealth. So many people in our culture think that money is a true indicator of riches. When people don't make a hefty wage it makes them feel bad about themselves. What Jesus tells us is that money does not indicate true wealth. Instead spiritual riches is what we should be striving for in our daily lives. I have spoken many times about how we tend to put money and material items at the forefront of our lives. In the reading we hear about the blessings and woes. He lets us know that we need to keep working on the true spiritual riches. As we get closer to Lent and we are starting to think about what we are going to sacrifice, may we take time to think about what we are putting before our God. The Divinity of the Family

As children, we are all introduced to the world in the same way: through our family. We develop traits similar to our family members simply as a result of spending the vast majority of our time with our families. Perhaps the best indication of the importance of the family is the tragic consequences that result from its absence. Across virtually every sociological metric available to us, the presence of a faithful, virtuous family is the single greatest factor in measuring a future adult's eventual well-being.

God's creation of the Earth was incomplete until the creation of the family. It took the creation of woman for man to fully understand his own creation. Man and woman are both fulfilled in their roles as fathers and husbands, mothers and wives, by completing the purpose of their counterpart. In Genesis 2:18, God says, "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him." In a modern setting, we are inclined to think that this means, "It's a pity that man is lonely." However, God understands that man's ultimate good—his purpose or end—is to be a part of a whole. The Ancient Greek and Hebrew fathers spoke a gendered language and understood this dynamic. Therefore, it is not good for man to be incomplete; mankind needs to complete their goal to guide their wives and children to Heaven. Similarly, in the lines "I will make a helper suitable for him," this does not mean, "I'll create someone to

help him out with chores and children and stuff." Womankind is the only creation suitable to help humanity with itself, to help their husbands and children to find Salvation. A woman's role in the family as both a wife to a husband and a mother to a child is completely irreplaceable.

God's value of a holy family is evident in his choice to become fully human, meaning born of a human mother. And not just any woman, mind you. Mary, a humble woman of Galilee, not one born into human wealth or human royalty. Yet by doing so, God shows us that mothers have a wealth and royalty far above any that can be granted by humanity. It is the wealth and royalty of the long-standing tradition of creation: mothers participate in God's creation more than any other living creation. God also chose for himself Joseph as a foster father, a carpenter who spent his days carrying long, heavy wood beams through the streets; a carpenter who shared this work with his son, teaching a young Jesus how to bear the toil of work that He would later complete in carrying His cross to Golgotha.

In a time when the idea of a faithful, holy family is constantly under attack, it can be difficult to find inspiration or motivation to carry on with our duty to our families. Yet we have only to look to the Holy Family God created to recognize that we are called to participate in the most divine act of family life: the very act of creation and salvation.






