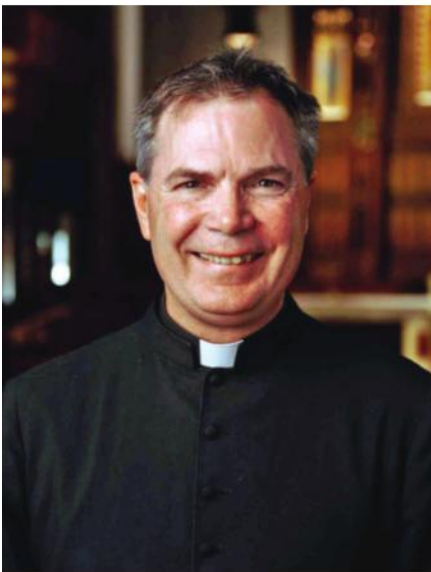

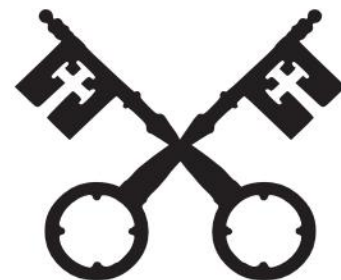

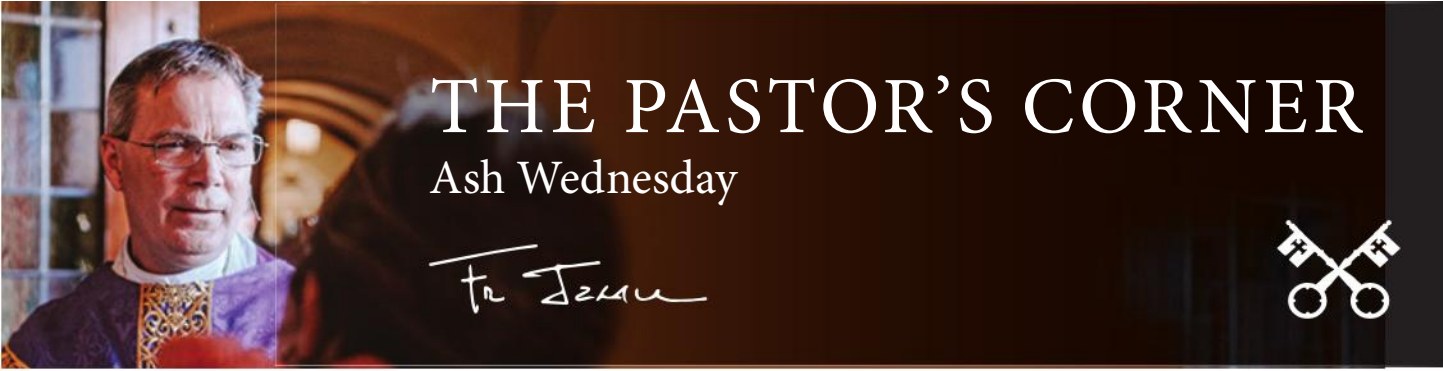

Ash Wednesday

The application of the ashes in the shape of a cross is a symbol of mortality. The term *Memento Mori*, means remember your death. This term is so important to help us live a focused life and to focus on living the values that help prepare us for the afterlife. We all know we are not guaranteed another day to live so we must examine our conscious' regularly and we must prioritize our spiritual lives.

On Tuesday we invite you to come to the Closing of Ordinary Time service (*more details below*) so that you can visibly see the beginning of Lent at St. Cecilia Church. This is something the whole family is invited to see. When we close the doors to the triptych we can feel the end of ordinary time and walk into a more penitential time. Prepare yourselves for this Lenten season. Take the time to look at our bulletin to know all of the ways you can strengthen your faith with our booklets, Lenten mission, Stations of the Cross, and other events to help you prioritize your spiritual growth this year.

Amen? Amen.

Palm-Burning Service

This Tuesday, March 4, at 6:30 p.m., at St. Cecilia, we will have a half-hour prayer service to close out Ordinary Time. This prayer service will include the solemn closing of the back altar doors, the addition of violet décor to the sanctuary and the singing of the last "Alleluia." The prayers will conclude with the burning of palms. The ashes of the palms will be used for the Ash Wednesday Masses. Please bring in your palms from previous Palm Sunday services, and place them in the containers that are located at all the doors.

Fasting

MORE THAN JUST GIVING UP SWEETS

When we think of fasting, what's the first thing that comes to mind? Do you think of giving something up, depriving yourself of something you love? Or do you think of detaching yourself from something of this world to aid yourself in turning more fully towards Christ?

Fasting benefits the spiritual life in numerous ways, sometimes in ways we don't see physically. It can uniquely allow us to draw closer to Christ while displacing idols we unknowingly venerate.

It can be a time of cleansing for us, a way to evaluate what in our lives we are giving more importance to than God. If we find ourselves lacking time to pray, but having time to scroll on our phones, fast from your phone and watch how much your relationship with Christ improves. Replacing false items in our life— such as sports, phones, shopping — with prayer time, with confession, a daily Mass, or extra time spent in adoration, we are reminding ourselves what is the proper order of things. Through fasting, we reprioritize God and let the idols of this world fall to the wayside.

One of the most powerful fasts we can undergo is a bread and water fast: 24 hours without eating anything but bread and not drinking anything but water. Our Lady called for this when she appeared to the children visionaries in her apparitions at Medjugorje. Here she reminds us that fasting has significant powers when used correctly — it can help bring spiritual clarity, but can also help rid our lives of evil. My Spiritual Director, Father Daniel Maria Klimek, does this bread and water fast every Wednesday and Friday; when he increases his prayer time during this fast, he notices a great difference and improvement in his spiritual life. He's had powerful experiences resting in the spirit during times of fasting where he's had vivid conversations with the Lord. This fast is not recommended

for the faint hearted, or for anyone with health issues — it is not good to put ourselves in harm's way when fasting (I don't recommend anyone jumping into this particular fast without careful consideration). However, sometimes stripping our life down to the bare necessities can bring a clarity we lack amidst the noise and chaos of this world.

Fasting is something that must be done intentionally; depending on the fast, (like Exodus 90, for example), it can be good to do with a group of people and let others know when you are fasting so you can be held accountable and feel a sense of community while you fast. It's important, too, to remember how Christ describes fasting in the Gospels:

"When you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites. They neglect their appearance, so that they may appear to others to be fasting. Amen, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, so that you may not appear to others to be fasting, except to your Father who is hidden. And your Father who sees what is hidden will repay you." - Matthew 6:16-18

It's imperative that, whatever fast we undertake, we do so with a posture of humility; a prideful fast typically causes more harm than good. This is not to say we must isolate ourselves while we fast, but rather, we must remember the purpose of our fast, which is to draw nearer to God, not bring glory to ourselves.

So, this upcoming Lent, I challenge you to give up more than just sweets, and replace it with time spent with Christ. You might be surprised by how positively it impacts your relationship with the Lord. He's calling us all into the desert with Him this Lent, and it is up to us to lay down the things of this world and Follow Him.

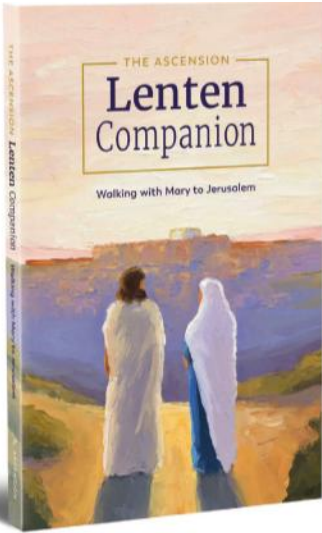

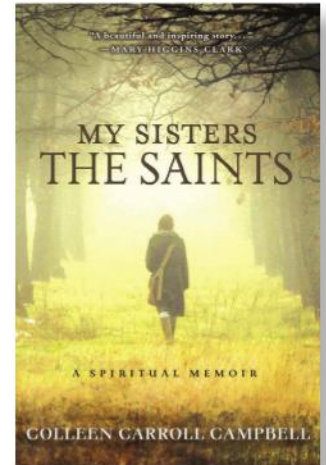


Young Adult Lenten Study
