The Rite of S E N D I N G

Today marks a momentous day in our family of parishes. It is a day that has been long awaited and diligently prepared for. It is a day of excitement and anticipation. It is a day that carries with it ritual and a final restatement of intentions. It is the day when 43 men and women from St. Cecilia and St. Mary will declare before all their desire to complete their final stage of preparation to join us as fully initiated Catholics at the Easter Vigil.

I've been involved with our OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation for Adults) program for the past five years, and it has been one of the most rewarding experiences of my life. Each summer as we receive a plethora of inquiries from those looking to convert to Catholicism, I reach out to friends and acquaintances from the parishes to see if they would be interested in serving as sponsors, eager for them to share in the joy that I have found walking with those looking to become one with Christ in His sacraments and His Bride, the Church. Now having had the opportunity to oversee this program as the Director, my passion for it has only increased tenfold. Not only am I able to see the Holy Spirit transform the heart of one candidate or catechumen I am sponsoring and rejoice with them over connections made in the classroom or new moments of intimacy in prayer, but I can witness the transformation of all those preparing to enter the Church and become more aware of the profound change these conversations have on sponsors and fellow catechists in prompting new levels of spiritual growth and comfortability with apologetics. I can't help but think about the potential for these moments to impact generations. Personally, it prompts me to pause and thank God for the "yes" my parents gave when converting to the Catholic faith when they were the same age as many of our participants.

As we celebrate the Rite of Sending in our parishes today and send our candidates and catechumen downtown for the Rite of Election, let us reflect upon what this ceremonious occasion prompts. As the Order of Christian Initiation for Adults states, "This rite offers that local community the opportunity to express its approval of the catechumens and to send them forth to the celebration of Election assured of the parish's care and support"(OCIA 107). May today be an opportunity for us to pray in a special way for these men and women preparing for baptism and full reception into the Catholic faith, and may it also be an extra nudge for each of us to express to them our excitement for their full participation in the life of the Church. Praise God for the good work He has begun in each of these candidates and catechumen, and may He bring them safely to their sacramental reception this Easter.








Young Adult Lenten Study




